Every year the Royal Medical Benevolent Fund helps hundreds of doctors, medical students and their family members who are in serious financial hardship.

Our aim is to make a real difference to the lives of medics in times of need. We try to help our beneficiaries become independent and self-sufficient again, while maintaining longer-term support for those who need it.

How we can help

Maintenance grants

For medical students facing exceptional hardship, the RMBF's Medical Student Programme offers grants to assist with essential living expenses while studying. The amount of each grant is set according to an individual's needs.

To be eligible for financial support, you must:

- be in exceptional and unexpected hardship due to ill health, disability or bereavement
- be in the final 2 years of your training (i.e. expecting Provisional Registration within 2 years)
- be a registered student on a course at a medical school in the UK which would meet the eligibility requirements for GMC registration
- intend to work in the UK after qualification
- be at serious risk of failing to qualify due to the financial pressures you face

CASE STUDY – ELIZABETH

I would have struggled to complete the course due to financial pressure. Thanks to them I was able to focus on exams and not have to worry about finances.

While in her final year at Hull York Medical School, Elizabeth was involved in a serious road accident which resulted in her having to use a wheelchair for three months. Elizabeth was unable to return to her studies in time to sit her final exams and was forced to re-start her final year. The added financial pressure of an extra year at medical school meant that Elizabeth was finding it increasingly difficult to make ends meet

Elizabeth contacted her medical school welfare team who recommended her for the RMBF's Medical Student Programme. The RMBF helped Elizabeth through her final year at medical school. Elizabeth passed her exams and has subsequently started her F1 post.
